CELEBRATING A CONNECTED COMMONWEALTH

11th March 2019, the Commonwealth Games Association of Zambia (CGA Zambia) joined the rest of the Commonwealth Community in Commemorating COMMONWEALTH DAY.

CGA Zambia commemorated this day for the first time ever and the 2019 edition was celebrated under the Theme: 'A CONNECTED COMMONWEALTH'.

2019 also marked 70 years since the establishment of the modern Commonwealth as it is configured now, with old ties and new links enabling cooperation towards social, political and economic development which is both inclusive and sustainable.

Team Zambia held the commemoration event at Lusaka Oaktree School in Makeni where various activities such as Educational Sessions on Commonwealth Values, Cultural display, Fun games, Hand Painting, Banner Signing and Tree Planting were done.

CGA Zambia President Mr. Alfred Foloko speaking at the event said that The Commonwealth Games Association of Zambia was commemorating the day for the first time ever despite Zambia competing in fourteen editions of the Commonwealth Games, the first being in 1954 as Northern Rhodesia.

Mr. Foloko said CGA Zambia perceived that the step taken will be sustained for future endeavors and lead to the growth of the association and will be able to promote the Commonwealth Games and its values at a larger scale.

"This event speaks for the commitment that all of us at CGA Zambia hold for the Commonwealth and everything it stands for," He added.

Meanwhile British High Commissioner to Zambia Mr. Fergus Cochrane-Dyet OBE who was guest of honour said that with over 2.4 Billion people, the Commonwealth is home to one third of the world's population, 60% of which are under 30. The Commonwealth network has influence in nearly every international country grouping, has some of the world's fastest growing economies and accounts of one-fifth of global trade.

Speaking at the same event Lusaka

Chimese highlighted the need for the
Commonwealth Day Commemoration
Local Organising Committee
to consider hosting a much bigger

Commonwealth Day celebration event at the School in the years to come.

There was also a presentation of #TeamZambia Athletes that have represented Zambia at Various multisport events i.e Benny Muziyo 2014 Glasgow Commonwealth Games Bronze Medalist (Boxing) and Hockey 5's u18 Players Phillimon Bwali and Joseph Mubanga who won Silver at the 2018 African Games in Algeria.

Also present at the event was Mrs. Brenda Chipande CGA Zambia Executive Director.

D.C.O TRAINING WORKSHOP

THE National Olympic Committee of Zambia (NOCZ) in conjunction with the National Sports Council of Zambia and Ministry of Youth Sport and Child Development hosted a Doping Control Officer training workshop from 26-28 January 2019 at the Olympic Youth Development Centre (OYDC) in Lusaka.

The Training workshop which was facilitated by Deslyn Pather a Senior Doping Control Coordinator from the South African Institute for Drug Free Sport attracted 10 participants including Dr. Titus Fernando who is also the Chairperson of the Medical Commission at NOCZ.

During the 3 day's workshop, DOC trainees covered topics such as the preparation of doping IOC and Out Of Center (OOC), Urine Sample collection procedure, report writing and recording keeping, DCO impacts on Anti-Doping Administration and Management System (ADAMS), OOC testing and recruiting and training Special Containment Procedures (SCP).

Speaking during the final day of the training workshop, Ministry of Youth, Sport and Child Development Director of Sport Mrs.

Bessie Chelemu urged the newly trained DCO's to promote zero tolerance towards doping and to also keep in mind that as DCO's, they will be called upon any time for them to execute their duties which means they have to be ready at any moment.

After completion of the training workshop, Zambia is expected to have 11 DCO's based on the results obtained from the examination which all the participants were subjected to.

ATHLETE involvement in decision-making is a core component of good governance within sports organisations. It is in this regard that the National Olympic Committee of Zambia (NOCZ) officially launched its first-ever Athletes' Commission with a workshop at the Olympic Youth Development Centre in Lusaka on 9th March 2019.

The workshop, facilitated by Association of National Olympic Committees of Africa Athletes' Commission member Kady Kanouté Tounkara, was also used to nominate the members and vote for the chairperson who will then sit on the NOCZ Executive Board.

The workshop attracted more than 20 athletes from over 10 National Sports Federations affiliated to NOCZ.

Track and field athlete Suwilanji Mpondela was voted in as the chairperson, while

fellow sprinter **Sydney Siame**, swimmer **Ralph Goveia**, basketball player **Sipho Changwe**, karateka **Seth Sibanda** and table tennis player **Mubanga Kunda** make up the Athletes Commission.

NOCZ President Alfred Foloko congratulated Mpondela and urged her to work closely with the Executive Board as she represents the athletes from the 25 National Federations affiliated to the organisation.

He claimed that the NOCZ is committed to ensuring athletes' voices are heard and experiences used for the improvement of sport.

Mr. Foloko also said that through the Olympic Solidarity, which aims to organise assistance for all the NOCs, the NOCZ has taken the initiative to create the Athletes' Commission for the period 2019-2020. Also in attendance was NOCZ Secretary General Mr. Boniface Kambikambi and its Executive Director Mrs. Brenda Chipande.

Alfred Foloko, President of the Zambian Judo Association and President of the National Olympic Committee of Zambia said: "The participation of refugees from a number of countries in our League is a demonstration that sport can be used as a tool for the integration of refugees in social and economic activities of Zambia. It further demonstrates the power that it has over other interventions in creating a conducive environment in which refugees can live. "

Last December, a new dojo, financed by the Norwegian Olympic Committee, was inaugurated within the Meheba Refugee settlement. Three of the four athletes who participate in Lusaka are now training in that dojo. It is sure that in the months to come, more of the refugee athletes will gain enough confidence to win more medals and to build a better life.
